DIABETES EDUCATION PROGRAM


Diabetes is a lifelong condition in which the body is unable to control the level of sugar in the blood. Normally the hormone insulin regulates the blood sugar level. In a person with diabetes, the body does not produce or properly use insulin which is needed to convert sugar and starches into energy.

Most diabetes patients can be managed with a balance of:

- Healthy eating
- Exercise and activity
- Medication

The **Diabetes Education Program** at Newman Regional Health is designed to provide education in a supportive environment that will help people with diabetes and their support person manage their diabetes for optimum health.

Upon referral from your physician, the program includes an initial assessment with a diabetes educator. **Classes** are offered on a monthly basis. A 3 month follow-up is provided to review goals, lab values, and discuss healthy eating and answer patient questions.



The **Diabetes Education Team** is made up of professionals who have additional education in diabetes management. These individuals may include:

- Registered Nurse
- Registered Dietitian
- Certified Diabetes Educator
- Registered Pharmacist
- Your own personal Physician
